- To extend repeating patterns overlapping, using two contrasting colours
- To be able to talk simply about own work and that of other artists

Words to understand and spell (Tier 3 Vocabulary)

Press	Apply pressure
Pattern	A repeated decorative design
Texture	The feel or appearance of a surface
Repeating	Recurring over a surface
Symmetry	Similar parts, reflection of the other half
Irregularity	Not smooth or not as you would expect a form to be
Contrasting	Differing strikingly
Overlapping	Extend over to cover partly
Arranging	Put in a neat order
