### Key facts to learn:

### Key skills to do:

- Use both hands and tools to build
  - Construct to represent personal ideas
  - Use materials to make known objects for a purpose
  - Carve into media using tools
  - Use Artists work to design and create a sculpture of their own
  - Create repeated patterns and pictures by printing from objects using more than one colour
  - Develop impressed images with some added pencil or decorative detail
  - Printing using fruit and vegetables
  - Use appropriate language to describe tools and process
  - Awareness and discussion of patterns around them – pattern hunt
  - Experiment creating repeating patterns on paper using drawing or printing block of own design

### Words to understand and spell (Tier 3 Vocabulary)

<b>Sculpture</b>	2 or 3D work represented by carving wood, stone, metal or plaster
<b>Carve</b>	Cut in order to produce an object, design or inscription
<b>Form</b>	A visible shape of something
<b>Printing</b>	A tile made with a pattern to create a repeated image
<b>Attach</b>	To join or fasten
<b>Mould</b>	a hollow container used to give shape
<b>Rubbings</b>	Paper laid over a design drawn over with coloured wax
<b>Pinch</b>	Grip tightly
