

- Artist study –Van Gogh. Most famous paintings were sunflowers, starry night, the irises and the bedroom
- Drawing with lines and patterns are key in preparation for painting in colour
  - Primary colours are red, yellow and blue
  - Colour wheels help you determine what 2 primary colours to mix in order to make secondary colours

## Key skills to do:

- Explore different textures and experiment with mark building on previous experience. Waves, lines, shading and cross hatching, different thicknesses of sketching pencil
- Observe and draw landscapes as accurately as possible, some small discussion of proportion and where the sky/sea is
- Observe patterns in the natural and man-made world
- Observe anatomy encourage accurate drawings of people 2D
- Sketch objects in both the natural and man- made world
  - Extend the variety of drawings tools to include charcoal and felt tips, biro, coloured pencils, pastels
  - Ensure you know the names of all the colours
  - Begin to introduce mixing of colours to make new colours. Colour wheel. Primary/secondary colours
  - Find collections of colour different sorts of green, blue, purple etc. mix their own brown
  - Use language to evaluate light/dark by adding white

Artist	a person who creates paintings or drawings as a profession or hobby	
Waves	Peaceful movements that flow	
Hatching	mediums that do not allow blending (e.g., pen and ink) to indicate shading, modeling, and light and shade
