Words to understand and spell (Tier 3 Vocabulary)

Textiles	A type of cloth or woven fabric
Template	A shaped piece of rigid material for processes such as cutting out
Criteria	A standard by which something is judged
Cross stitch	A stitch formed of two stitches crossing each other
Applique	Needle work in which pieces of fabric are sewn or stuck on to a larger piece to form a picture or pattern
Weave	Form by interlacing long threads passing in one direction
Appearance	The way in which something looks
Layered	Arrange in a layer or layers
Independence	The ability to do things on your own
Stuffing	Material use to fill
Decorate	Make something more attractive
