Artist study: William Morris (Oxfordshire artist)

Key skills to do:

- Select and use materials to achieve a specific outcome
- Look at pattern, tone, shape, mood, emotion
- Embellish work, using a variety of techniques, including drawing, painting and printing on top of textural work – Montage
- Consider methods of making fabric
- Regularly analysing and reflecting on their intentions and choices
- Use initial sketches to aid work
- Continue experimenting with creating mood, feeling, movement and areas of interest
- Look at fabrics/wall paper designs and discuss
- Compare designs of William Morris with own designs
- Discuss different types of fabric that could be used
- Use a wider variety of stitches to 'draw' with and develop pattern and texture – e.g. zig zag stitch, chain stitch, seeding
- Use padding, quilt/projects, stitching to add detail

Words to understand and spell (Tier 3 Vocabulary)

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Hessian	A strong, coarse fabric used for sacks
Montage	Piecing together separate pieces of material
Crumple	Crush so it becomes creased or wrinkled
Stitches	A loop of thread resulting in a single pass of the needle
Zig-zag stitch	A back and forth stitch used to reinforce
Chain stitch	An embroidered stitch
Quilt	A cover made of padding between layers of fabric
Padding	Soft material such as foam used to pad something
Embellish	Make something more attractive by the addition of decorative details
