Holbein	German artist who worked in the 16 <sup>th</sup> century.

Fleur-de-lys	A symbol that represents purity and nobility.	
Renaissance	A culture and style of art and architecture developed in the 14 <sup>th</sup> – 16 <sup>th</sup> century.	
Doublet	A close fitted padded jacket worn in the 14 <sup>th</sup> to 17 <sup>th</sup> century.	
Observation	The action or process of closely observing or monitoring something or someone.	
Gargoyle	A grotesque carved human or animal face, or figure projecting from a gutter of a building.
