Key Knowledge to Learn:

- How the physical geography of a place influences the animals that can live there.
- To counter-act any stereotypes about a location (i.e. not everyone in Africa is poor). Explore some stereotypes that existed in the past.
- To begin to compare a foreign locality with the place that I live.
- To know the difference between a village, town, country and continent.

Key skills to do:

- Name the seven continents and five oceans.
- Compare a UK locality with somewhere outside of the UK.
- Observe similarities and differences.
- Understand and use basic vocabulary relating to human and physical geography such as coast, beach, city and town.
- Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns.
- Begin to use maps to locate places.
- Interpret geographical information from a range of sources, such as photos and maps.
