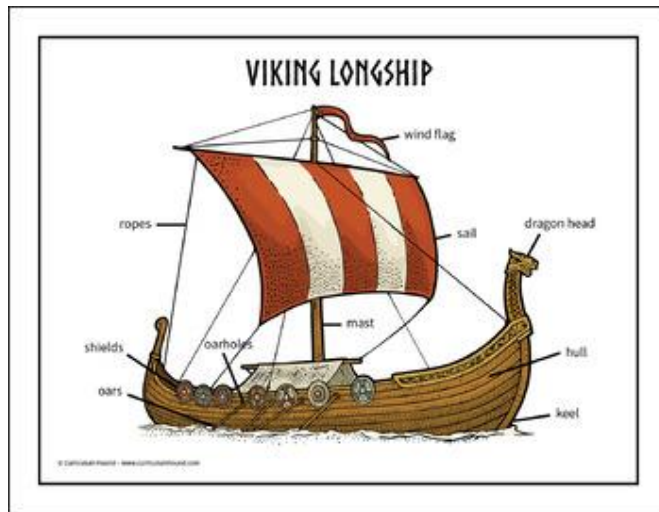


## KS2 History KCV – The Vikings

### Subject Specific Vocabulary (Tier 3)

chronological	a record of events following the order in which they occurred.
artefact	an object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.
source	a source is something that provides information about the historical topic being studied. They can either be written (e.g. books or websites), or non-written (e.g. photographs or artefacts).
invasion	an incursion by a large number of people or things into a place or sphere of activity.
conquest	the subjugation and assumption of control of a place or people by military force.
territory	an area of land under the jurisdiction of a ruler or state.
