

Unit 3 – Spanish KCV – Do you have a pet?/ Phonetics 3 – ¿Tienes una mascota?

- Recall the correct Spanish pronunciation for 8 common pets
- Recognise 8 common pet names in the written form and pronounce them accurately
- Learn the pronunciation of five of the key sound patterns/phonemes: GA GE GLGO GU to
