Nosotros comemos	We eat (masculine form)
Nosotras bebemos	We drink (feminine form)
Vosotros vivís	You all live (masculine form)
Vosotras habláis	You all speak (feminine form)
Ellos comen	They eat (masculine form)
Ellas beben	They drink (feminine form)
