Prior Learning

Children will have completed glockenspiel stage 1 in year 3 and had some experience of using one in year 2.

Key Learning

Know how to play simple tunes and songs on the glockenspiel.

Be able to sing and play the glockenspiel at the same time.


Be able to compare the pitch of the notes on a

Subject Specific Vocabulary		
Rhythm	a strong, regular repeated pattern of movement or sound.	
Pulse	The beat in the music.	
Pitch	How high or low the note is.	
Structure	the arrangement of a song.	
Chorus	A repeated section of a song, often the climax.	
Improvise	Create or perform spontaneously without preparation.	
Melody	A sequence of notes that make a tune.	
Dynamics	the volume of a sound or note.	
Tempo	the pace or speed at which a section of music is played.	
Compose	Write or create	
Keys	The bars on a glockenspiel that you hit to make a sound.	
Percussion	musical instruments played by striking with the hand or with a stick or beater, or by shaking.
