Prior Learning

Key Learning

By the end of the term children will have gained the following knowledge and skills:


Listen and Appraise Classical music.

Continue to embed the foundations of the interrelated dimensions of music using voices and instruments. Given an extract of a song, being able to pick out the music that is being played. E.g. 'Dancing Queen' by Abba, picking up the fact that the chorus composes of: drums, violin, backing singers, female vocals, piano and bass guitar.

Begin to look at how music can be written down including the use of Staves and Clefs.

Improvisation using voices and instruments.

	Subject Specific Vocabulary
Stave	A set of five horizontal lines and four spaces that each represent a different musical pitch.
Clef	A musical symbol used to indicate the pitch of written notes.
Semibreve	Equal to four crotchets and takes up and entire measure in time.
Semibreve Rest	A pause or interval of silence equal in duration to two half rests or ne half of a breve rest.
