SMSC Links:

Social – Working with others to explore a range of strategies to manage feelings in bullying situations and for problem-solving when being part of one.

Moral – Children can understand racism and be aware of their own, and others, attitudes towards people from other races.

Spiritual – Consider aspects of life for children in the developing world.

Cultural – Understanding, respecting and celebrating cultural differences and understanding the conflict this can cause.

Words to understand and spell (Tier 3 Vocabulary)

Culture	The ideas, customs and social behaviour of particular people/society.
Conflict	A serious disagreement or argument, clash of opposing feelings.
Discrimination	Unjust or prejudicial treatment of others based on race, sex, age etc
Racism	Prejudice and discrimination against someone of a different race.
Excluded	Deny someone access to a place, group or privilege.
Derogatory	Showing a critical or disrespectful attitude.
Homophobic	Having or showing a dislike or prejudice against homosexual people.
Continuum	A continuous sequence in which elements are not different.
Indirect bullying	Not directly caused by or resulting from something e.g. rumours.

Concept check questions. Test yourself:

Which aspects of your culture are the same/different to other members of the class? Which aspects may cause conflict? How might it feel to be discriminated against because of your colour or appearance? Do you understand the different types of bullying, e.g. racist, homophobic? Do you know how you can prevent bullying of any type?
