The Qur'an was dictated to Muhammad by the Angel Jibreel (Gabriel(when Muhammad could neither read or write.

The Qur'an contains some material that is similar to the Old Testament.

Abraham, Moses, Joseph, David and Jesus are in the Qur'an more than Muhammad.

When the Qur'an is at home it is given special treatment; it is kept on the highest possible shelf, wrapped in cloths and people wash thoroughly before touching it.

The Qur'an is placed on a stand before reading it and touched as little as possible.

In the Mosque, the Qur'an is stored on shelves as the whole building is considered holy and pure.

The tales of Muhammad are mostly found in the Hadith.

The tales in the Hadith show many Muslim practices.

The Hadith is a different text with different intentions and treated differently from the Qur'an.

God is known as Allah to Muslims and is identified by 99 names

The key teachings of the Qur'an are that there is one God, Allah and that Muhammad is his last messenger.
