### Key Knowledge

In the bible God is shown to communicate with humans in a variety of ways: dreams, visions, angels and face to face.

The books of the Old Testament from Isaiah to Malachi are considered to be books of the prophecy.

Christians believe that the Christmas story is an example of a prophecy that shows that Jesus is the son of God.

Christians believe that the birth of Jesus was told before it happened.

God communicated with many of the main characters in the nativity story e.g. the angels are heavenly beings that bring God's word to people and that people acted on what they heard.

Christians understand prayer as communication with God as it is both speaking and listening and in the Bible Christians understand that they are reading God's words.

Sikhs believe that God communicated through meditation; he has revealed himself through his creation as he is creator, sustainer and destroyer.

God communicates by his spirit, and also through people's common sense and divine enlightenment.
