Key Concept Questions

Why is Christmas important for Christians?

Why is Jesus's name important?

Why is Jesus's death as important to Christians as his birth?

Is Christian belief in Jesus as God incarnate, similar to Hindu belief in Avatars?

Is Christmas still meaningful for people who are not Christian and do not believe that Jesus was God in human form?



For Christians it is the time to celebrate the birth of Jesus, born to a Virgin by the power of the Holy Spirit Jesus is understood to be God made Man and the name Emmanuel or Immanuel mean "God with us" The so called traditional Christmas narrative is only present in 2 of the 4 gospels (Matthew and Luke) and even then some of the elements most familiar in the western world are only present in one of the two.

The prophecies of Isaiah 6 and Micah 2 tell of Jesus as the Son of God who will save them.

The name Jesus (Joshua or Yeshua) means "he saves" and Christ and Messiah both mean "anointed one". Aritzi created a painting called 'Incarnation' which depicts the incarnation as a kind of explosion – the young Jesus flies down like a lightening from the divine hand to the slave peoples of the USA and to all who are in bondage. A black Jesus is seen as the hope of the wretched – he will be their saviour. This is not a 'Christmas card' view of God coming to earth. But the title 'incarnation' is the word Christians use to explain God becoming human in Jesus.
