eyewitness	A person who has seen something happen
true	Agreeing with the facts
subjective	Based on personal feelings and opinions not facts.
gospel	One of the first four New Testament books telling of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ

Key Knowledge

Eye-witness accounts are subjective and even though we have all witnessed the same event, we each see things through our own lens.

Scientific truth is based on facts eg the sun rises in the east and sets in the west.

Historical truth is not an absolute truth but is based on a person's perspective of a series of events in History.

Personal truth is based on people's own beliefs.

The Christmas story tells of the birth of Jesus who Christians believe is the son of God.

The story of Jesus's birth differs in the gospel of Matthew and Luke.(Luke Ch 1: 26-38 and Ch 2: 1-20 /Matthew Ch 1: 18 - Ch 2: 12)
