Is it important to be truthful?

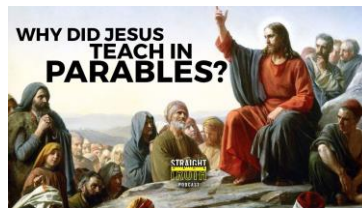
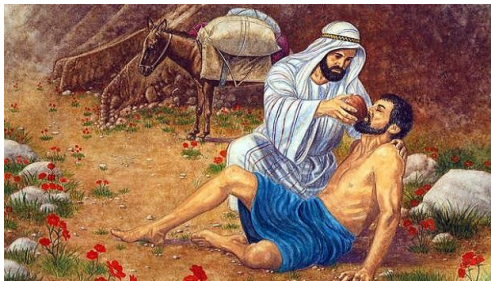
Is there a difference between story and untruth?

Were all stories that Jesus told the truth? Why were some stories exaggerated?

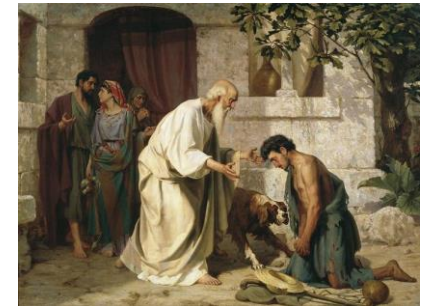
Is it more important that the stories are truthful or that they teach people through them?

Truths	Real events or facts
untruths	Something that is not true
Samaritan	Charitable or helpful person



Key Knowledge

Jesus taught his disciples and the crowds using parables - stories that had a message.

Some of the stories that Jesus taught were exaggerated.

Matthew 13:10 – 17 suggests that Jesus is deliberately making things harder to understand, so that people have to think, rather than taking things at face value.

Understand that there are messages hidden in stories e.g. the Good Samaritan, Lost Sheep and the Lost Son.
