
Y3/4 RE: Christianity – What is it like for Christians to follow God?





Why are we learning about Christianity?



We are <u>building on</u> our previous learning about Christians' interpretation of the story of Creation and the concept of God as the forgiving father. This <u>new learning</u> is important because Christian beliefs have helped shape the development of the UK and the values that it holds dear. By learning about 'The People of God', we can reflect on our understanding of the stories and teachings in the Bible. We can also reflect on the impact they may have on our own lives, both at school and in the wider community. Learning about 'The people of God' also offers the opportunity to explore similarities between Christianity and other faiths. This will help us get ready for <u>future learning</u> about making clear connections between belief in the Kingdom of God and how Christians put their beliefs into practice in different ways.

- To know that God had made a pact with Noah and a promise to keep
- To know how a Christian ceremony initiates a partnership between two people and to God
- To know the story of Abraham and Sarah and the faith they had in God
- To know that William Booth founded the Salvation Army, and they continue to help those in need.

Skills we need to learn:

- I can explain the covenant (pact) God and Noah had
- I can discuss the promises made at a wedding between the two people but also with God
- I can summarise the story of Abraham and Sarah
